Committing funds to a single use facility "Olde Town Hall" means no funds for other facilities in need. (Super Build Grants every 10 years)

Pool Building critical / Pool 54 years old

Lions Pavilion structure critical

#### **Issues:**

#### **Surplus Lands / Facilities**

Land identified in Recreation Plan: Proton Station, Dromore, Hopeville, Holstein, Swinton Park, Memorial Park

Buildings identified in Recreation Plan: Hopeville Pavilion, Swinton Park Community Centre, Olde Town Hall, Dundalk Arena Ice Surface.

#### **Capital Plans:**

Finish Auditorium Project

Furnishings \$8,000 (two sofa, TV, gaming, dishwasher and other)

Rock Climbing Wall \$10,000

Tables \$3,500 Purchased by Reunion Committee Donation

Beach Volleyball Court Memorial Park

### **Operating:**

Holstein Park Washrooms line walls with poly \$2,000

Holstein Park landscape from Bridge repair including removing hedge and replace with fencing \$5,000

Holstein Ball Lights Hydro Supply Poles \$15,000

Ice Surface Overhead Door replaced was identified as safety concern \$10,000

# 2021 & 2022 – Planned Capital Projects and Operation Goals for Consideration

#### **Capital Plans:**

Multi-use Facility Identified was to include Community Hall, Theatre, Indoor Pool, Social Services, Seniors Centre and Lobby Common Area for New Arena

Subdivision Trails and Links

Replace Zero Turn Lawn Mower

#### **Operating:**

Put ice in Arena under new Amalgamation. See the results in ice rentals and operating cost. Can programming keep arena a valued asset to the community

### 2023 to 2029 Plan for New Infrastructure & Service Delivery that is a requirement based on Southgate's present Assessment Base

- Fund will be limited with the Olde Town Hall Project for new infrastructure
- Identified by trends set by similar communities in growth:
- Pool
- Fitness
- Facilities for Soccer Fields
- Youth Common Area (Recreation and Culture) Expect to outgrow Arena Auditorium Renovation
- Seniors Common Area Plus Social and Health Services.
- Community Identity and Hub Centre

# 2023 to 2029 Plan for New Infrastructure & Service Delivery that is a requirement based on Southgate's on anticipated future Development Growth:

The expectation of Recreation that was supplied by the community in which the new residents are moving from will drive need. 7-9pm

- Repurposed Arena / Outdoor skating rink
